

WAUSHARA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE

Our contract with the State of Wisconsin Department of Corrections to house state inmates has been extended through 2011 with no increase in the daily rate. Unfortunately the State will be reducing the number of inmates we house by at least 30/day. We are currently housing additional state inmates under the Extensive Sanctions program at the same daily rate.

The Sheriff's Office remained active in the community during 2010 by supporting the usual groups and events including Crime Stoppers, D.A.R.E., Blue Ribbon Kids Day, Post Prom, Domestic Outreach, Neighborhood Watch, Coordinated Community Response Team, Shara Olympics, Salvation Army, Hispanic Focus Group, Dairy Breakfast, County Fair, Safe Exchange, TRI AD, Drug Endangered Children Task Force, Community Events and local government meetings. Our Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) efforts with Marquette & Green Lake are progressing.

Waushara County Crime Stoppers is in the 3rd year of a 5 year commitment to support an annual marathon as a means to raise funds for Crime Stoppers and the Canine program. The canines have been utilized by the Drug Task Force both in and out of the county as well as within our jail facilities, on search warrants and routine traffic stops. Crime Stoppers lost funding through the County System and continues working to find new sources to continue being able to financially support the program.

We have attended village and town board meetings whenever requested, and attempted to get to each municipality at least once during the year. We want to stay in touch with local issues before they become major problems. Our Boat Patrol continues to have a positive impact on boating safety and the communities that surround our area lakes. We received \$14,372 reimbursement from the DNR for performing boat & snowmobile patrol duties.

Deputy Gary Grenier retired from the Sheriff's Office after 36 years of service to the community.

The training of staff remains a high priority as a means to manage risk, limit our exposure and better serve Waushara County. Training is necessary to stay current with new laws and techniques in our effort to maintain the safety and security of everyone that resides in and/or visits Waushara County. There are many training opportunities available and we look for those that offer the best value. Trainings included utilizing firearms simulation equipment available through WCA, joint training with Green Lake and Marquette Counties in domestic violence and sexual assault, crash investigation with Wisconsin State Patrol, legal updates with Wisconsin Department of Justice, emergency preparedness for jails, suicide prevention, interview and interrogation techniques.

We have signed a contract with the Town of Marion to provide 20-25 hours per week of law enforcement services. This is being staffed without increasing staff.

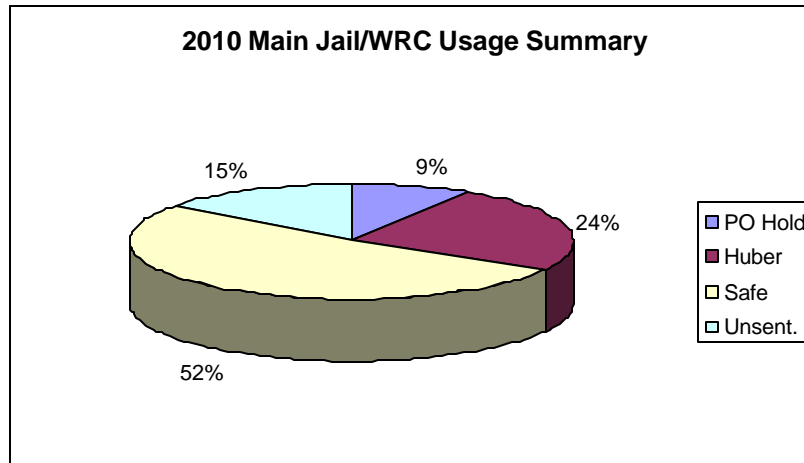
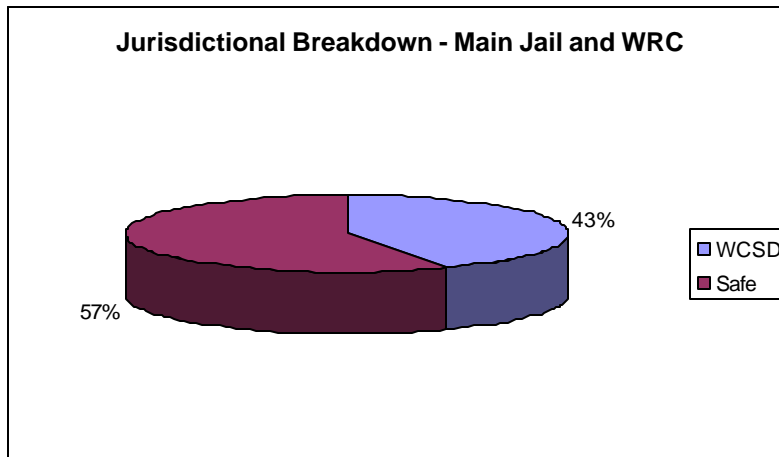

In February we went live with the in-squad video system in the patrol squads. This system has allowed the road officers to record their activities. This has helped with prosecution and complaints against department members.

In August we went live with the State of Wisconsin Badger TraCS program. This electronic citation and crash report program allows the road officers to handle all citations, warnings and crash reports in an electronic format. This allows for distribution to the state and courts system over the internet. A side benefit is that all forms are not hand written which allows for easy reading by all users.

We applied for and were awarded a State of Wisconsin DOT grant for Youth Alcohol Enforcement. This \$5,000.00 grant allowed us to concentrate on underage drinking violations.

In the fall we were awarded a State of Wisconsin DOT grant for \$15,000.00 for seatbelt and OWI enforcement. This included \$10,000.00 for overtime and \$5,000.00 for equipment.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Six planning facilities updated their response plans. There were no reported extremely hazardous materials released.

Waushara County participated in the annual Statewide Tornado Awareness Drill. Weather Spotter training was provided to first responders and the public.

The All Hazards Mitigation Plan for Waushara County was approved by FEMA and Wisconsin Emergency Management Bureau of Response and Recovery Section.

Waushara County participated in a Regional Long Term Power Outage exercise along with 12 other counties within the Wisconsin Emergency Management East Central Region.

2011 CHALLENGES & GOALS

- The reduction in contract beds will necessitate considering the closing of the Work Release Center and housing all inmates at the Jail.
- New procedures to provide security at the Courthouse, North and South Annex as well as inmate movement to the Courts will need to be developed.
- The implementation of an all inclusive records management system will require additional training and growing pains, but the end result should improve our service delivery to the community.
- The upgrading of radio communications to the mandated narrowbanding while maintaining daily operations will be challenging, but should serve the county well into the 21st century.
- State and local budget constraints.
- Citizen expectations for service.
